

## History of the Stonyford Museum

The Stonyford Town Hall, located between the Stonyford Post Office And the Community Hall was built in 1899. The property was purchased with \$1.00 gold coin from Mr. John McDaniel of Stonyford.

The antique curtain across the stage served the Town Hall for many years. The painting on the stage curtain of "The Lady on the Lake" was painted by George Bradley in 1912. On the back of the painting/curtain are drawings and signatures listing some of the movies and shows that graced the stage. George Bradley was a relative of the Evans family.

The building was 112 years old when it was restored to become a museum. This renovation was possible through a State grant. The Community is currently researching ways to restore the curtain.
